





Millions of people around the world are effected by breast cancer each year. Whether it be directly or indirectly, it is an experience that stays with you forever. For the past four years, Auburn University has hosted a grand event called All

In, All Pink in the heart of campus. This is a breast cancer awareness event for the campus and local community. The focus of the event is to heighten awareness and encourage the Auburn family to actively take preventative measures.



This event was founded by one of our very own, Ebony Craig Jackson. She started the event in 2010 in partnership with the Office of the VP for University Outreach and her undergraduate sorority. The passion to promote such an event was driven by the strong presence of breast and ovarian cancer in her family. The disease infected at least 4 women on her maternal side and even took the life of an uncle.







Since its beginning in 2010, All In, All Pink has grown tremendously and is something that the Auburn community looks forward to. It has also gained several partners, including the Chi Chapter of Phi Delta Chi. This event includes survivors who are willing to share their stories as well as health care professionals. There is live entertainment, the Auburn University Gospel Choir being a crowd favorite. University offices sponsor free food, T-shirts and promotional items. In return, they ask that participants only give donations. All proceeds go to the Cancer Center of East Alabama

Medical Center. Each year, the event climaxes with a balloon release in honor of all those who lost the fight. The Brothers of the Chi Chapter look forward to a continued relationship with this worthy event.


Several brothers also volunteered at the Boys and Girls Club in Opelika, AL on Saturday, March 7th. They worked on painting inside the facilities and moving furniture.






















# Leadership






## $\mathcal{L}\mathcal{D}.\mathcal{S}.$ —Tampa, FL

## Legislative Day 2015

On Wednesday, April 22<sup>nd</sup>, several Brothers from the Chi chapter traveled to the State Capital in Montgomery, AL for a luncheon hosted by the Alabama Pharmacy Association. This was my second year to attend Legislative day with APA and our state representatives. The purpose this year's luncheon was to speak to our representatives about supporting HB494, the Collaborative Drug Therapy Management Act. This bill would officially put in writing that pharmacists may collaborate with other healthcare professionals in the state of Alabama to provide more comprehensive health care for the residents of Alabama. This bill is important to me because the more we are able to collaborate with healthcare providers, the more comprehensive care we can provide to our patients that depend on us on a daily basis.

We also spoke with our representatives to fully fund Alabama Medicaid for the next fiscal year. Without fully funding Medicaid, the entire healthcare industry in Alabama would take a serious hit and the consequences would be felt state wide. It is important that, as future pharmacists, we support current legislation that can impact the future of healthcare.

Jackson, Trey White and myself were in attendance for this year's Legislative Day where we were able to meet two of our Brothers from Gamma Lambda, Anthony Todd and Josh Francis. 
