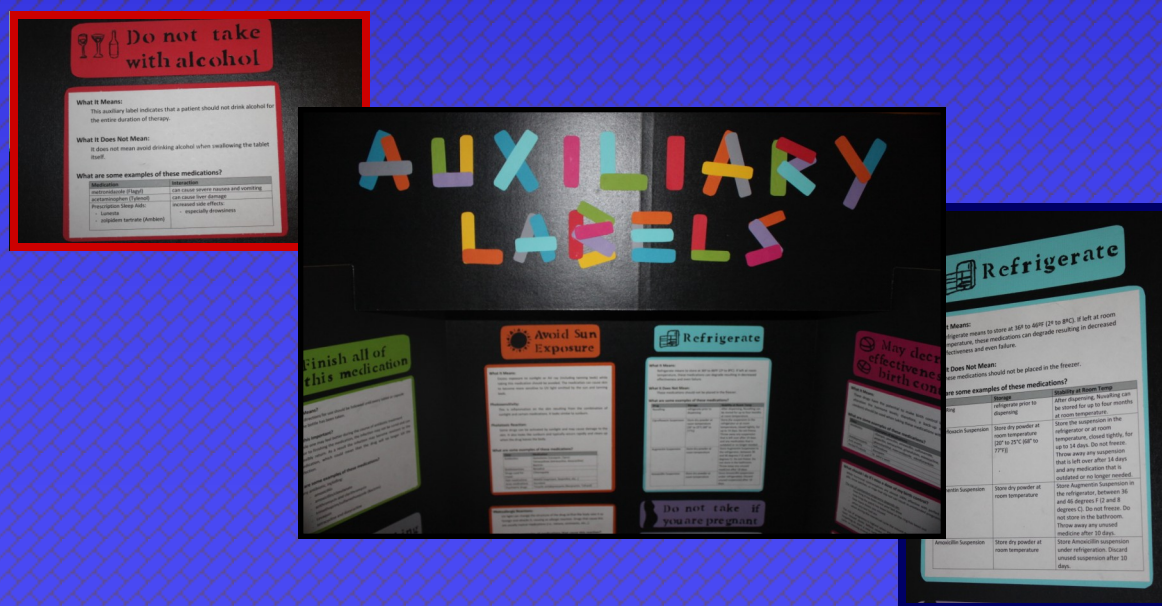

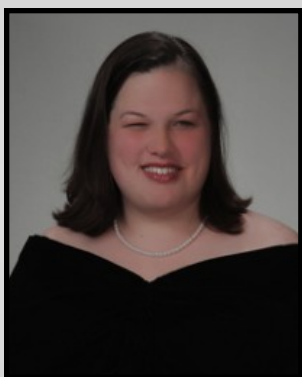

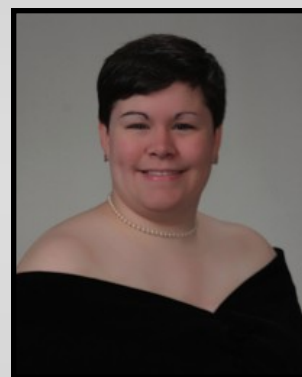

SCHOLARSHIP

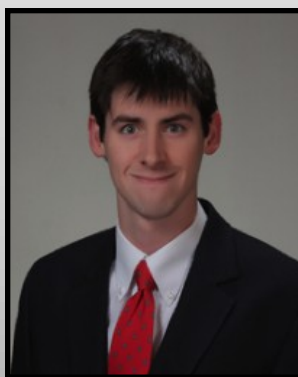

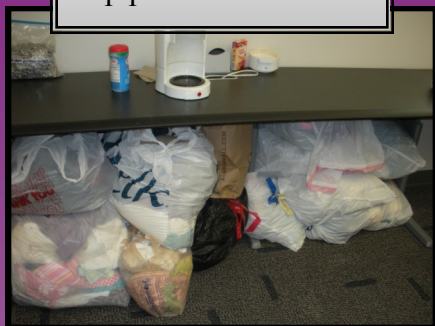
Pop Tops for the Ronald McDonald House



The Brothers of Phi Delta Chi, Chi Chapter, joined together in an effort to raise funds that would build more Ronald McDonald Houses in Birmingham Alabama. The Ronald McDonald Houses provide families of seriously ill or injured children a temporary home near treatment centers while their loved ones receive therapy. Pop tabs were collected starting in September 2010 ending in March 2011. Pop tabs are collected instead of the entire aluminum cans because they are made of high-quality aluminum, unlike cans which are made of aluminum and other alloys. After the tabs are collected, they were brought to our local Ronald McDonald House located in Birmingham, AL. The Chi Chapter was able to collect 2 gallons of pop tabs. As of April 7th, 2011, Birmingham's Ronald McDonald House has raised \$4,559.90, for the 41 families staying at the Ronald McDonald House in Birmingham.

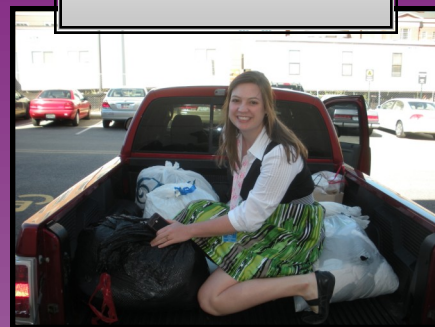

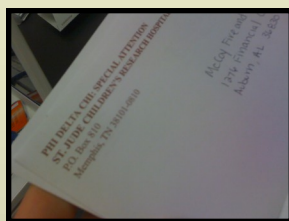
St. Jude Letter Writing Campaign

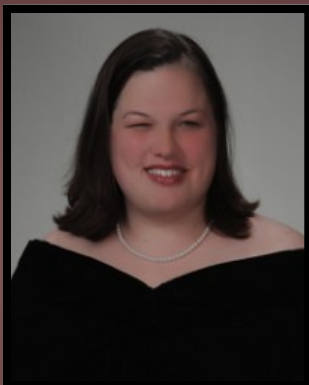
